Board Meeting Minutes

Minutes of the San Juan Quilters Guild Board Meeting – September 15, 2011

The meeting was called to order @ 9:05 am.

The following items were added to the agenda on a motion made by Cathy Korzan and 2nd by Karen Bain. Old Business: Museum items

New Business: Programs 2012, Christmas Party, Website password

A motion to accept the minutes as distributed was made by Dixie Jackson and 2nd by Joann Oakes

The financial report was distributed.

Old Business

Cookbooks. The books will use pictures from the 2011 quilt show. The cutoff date for books being ready at the Christmas party is November 13, 2011. Will this be an ongoing project that needs a budget line item? Discussion followed regarding how many books to order. The President will ask at the next meeting for a show of hands of the membership who would be interested in receiving copies of the book. The museum would like to have 12 copies. And other local shops may also want to carry the books. The Guild could sell the recipe book while selling tickets for the Opportunity quilt. The committee members will do a mock-up order for total costs so the SJQG will have an idea of what the project will cost and how much would be charged for the recipe books.

Policy or procedure changes. The President will distribute the final proposed policy & procedures document at the October meeting and the membership will vote on the document at the November meeting.

Inventory records. Jill Fischer has volunteered to inventory the items in storage when they are brought to the Civic Center for the 2011 Quilt Show. The items being inventoried are non-consumable items (i.e. fixed assets).

Museum Items. Key chains and bookmarks will be made by members who stay after the November meeting. 100 key chain fobs can be purchased for \$40. The items sold at the museum will have a sticker about the guild on the back of the museum card attached to the item. Dixie Jackson made the motion that we do this project and it was 2nd by Joyce Mills.

New Business

Newsletter items. Items are due to the Newsletter Chairman by the end of today.

Programs 2012. Programs for the year are very nearly set. After discussion, it was decided to prepare kits for the day and evening meetings of the item being made at the meetings.

Christmas party. The party will be December 13. The cost will be \$17.50 per person and there will be wine available for those who would like a glass, for \$5 per glass. Tickets for the dinner will be available at the October and November meetings. Dinner will start at 6:30 with a 30 minute social hour before dinner.

Committee reports

Community Service: The committee will accept quilting donations (i.e. fabric or UFO's) and toiletries only.

Ticket Sales: Aztec has Highland Games the 1st and 2nd of October. The opportunity quilt will be displayed and tickets will be sold.

Hospitality: October meeting, members will bring salads and desserts. November meeting will be potluck.

Membership: One new member joined at the last meeting. In August, 49 attended the day meeting, 16 attended the evening meeting with 7 at both meetings. In September, 47 attended the day meeting, 20 attended the evening meeting and 10 attended both meetings. These numbers are members that actually signed in.

Quilt Show: Everything is going well. The auxiliary members will be involved in the demonstrations.

Programs: The Cancer Center people who gave the September program are going to donate their fee to the Cathy Lincoln Memorial Fund. The additional cancer leaflets will be brought to the next 2 meetings.

Newsletter: When a person has a change to an email address or a mailing address PLEASE let the membership and the newsletter chairmen know. A few copies of the newsletter will be made available at each meeting.

Thrift Shop: Everything in the thrift shop was gotten rid of at the last meeting. There will not be a thrift shop next year. A member may bring her own stuff to sell which has already been programmed into 2012 by the Program Chairwoman.

Miscellaneous:

New Member Packets: It was suggested that new member packets be developed. That way any new member would be provided with a roster and short explanation of door prizes, fat quarter drawing, raffle tickets, and how the meetings and programs work.

Quilt Show: A suggestion was made to think about having the quilt show every other year instead of every year. This could start after the next 2 shows.

Inviting old members back to guild: Old rosters will be accessed and letters will be sent to old members inviting them to rejoin the guild.

A motion was made by Linda Barlow and 2nd by Ellen Vandruff to adjourn the meeting.

He stood at the door of the studio and declared it was easier to get in the car and go buy a new one than to search through the mess.

Do any of these stories sound familiar? Well, you are in luck! This is the time and place to get rid of some of those things without feeling guilty and make a little cash at the same time.

In March we will have the “Re-Stash – A Quilter’s Garage Sale” event. So, start cleaning out your studio, closet, or corner now. Anything in the categories qualifies:





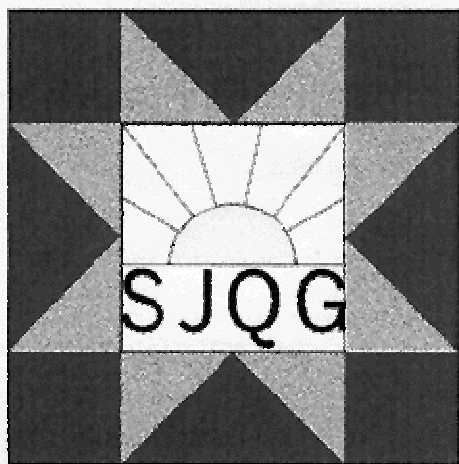
