Minutes of San Juan Quilters' Guild Board

March 11, 2010

The meeting was called to order by president, Kristi Necaie, at 9:04 AM. The president provided an agenda for members to follow.

Minutes of the January 14, 2010 meeting were read by Betsy Lee, vice president. There were no corrections to be made. The board approved these minutes with no corrections, following a motion by Joyce Mills and a second by Cathy Korzan.

Joyce Mills requested a clarification in regard to the quilt show referred to in Connie's presentation at the January meeting. Connie and other members of the Guild worked on organizing the quilt show that was put on by the guild and held at the Farmington Museum. Connie then worked further with the Farmington Museum for the research on her book. This was accepted following a motion made by Shari Schmitt and a second by Tami Brown.

An amendment to the January meeting minutes was made concerning the donation for Connie's book that was previously approved at the January meeting. An issue concerning the legality of this donation was brought to the board's attention. After seeking legal advice from Kyle M. Finch, Attorney at Law on February 5, 2010, it was determined that the donation would be in violation of the guilds current bylaws. A meeting of the executive board was called by president, Kristi Necaie, and upon discussion it was voted that the donation could not be made.

A report of the Audit Committee was read by President Kristi Necaie. The audit was performed for the fiscal year 2009 by Linda Krake and Linda Barlow. The books were found to be in outstanding order with no discrepancies noted. The committee commended Virginia Miller for the outstanding job she has done in maintaining the financial books during the year 2009. A job well done goes to Virginia Miller, Thank you!! Also, a thank you to Linda Krake and Linda Barlow for taking the time to complete the audit. The audit was approved after a motion was made by Betsy Lee and a second by Shari Schmitt.

A treasures report was given by Dixie Jackson. After discussion the report was approved following a motion by Betsy Lee and a second by Joyce Mills.

#### Old Business

The Guild insurance policy was reviewed and it was found that the vendors at the quilt show will need to provide the Guild with a copy of their Certificate of Insurance for the Quilt Show.

Shari Schmitt made a presentation to the board concerning the possible addition of a children's Auxiliary membership as a trial. After much discussion a motion was made by Betsy Lee, that Shari provides a presentation to all Guild members to be done at the April Meetings both day and night. Then a vote would take place at both regular meetings in May. It was also suggested that the vote be done by means of a ballot with the opportunity for comments. A second was made by Tami Brown. This motion was then approved.

#### New Business

Dixie Jackson brought up a suggestion that the Guild explore the necessity of obtaining DNO insurance. DNO insurance is Directors and Officers Insurance for Non-profit organizations. Betsy will be working on this and will get the board more information on this. This item was tabled pending the receipt of this information.

The Board discussed the need for a replacement secretary since Francine is unable to complete her duties, due to a family emergency. There is an ongoing search for this position. A motion was made by Betsy Lee that when a replacement is found, the approval will be made by the executive board. A second was made by Ellen Vandruff. This motion was approved.

#### Committee Reports

Quilt Show - Shari reported her committee is working hard. They are still working on ribbons and categories to be finalized later. Thursday lunch will provided by the PV High School kids, Fridays lunch will be provided by Ellen & Frank Vandruff, and Saturdays lunch will be provided by Anna Lawing.

Hospitality -The proposed menu for April will be Mexican dishes and the menu for May will be a Salad Bar. A signup sheet for items to bring to the May meeting will be passed around at the April Meeting.

Membership - Ellen reported we have 133 current members.

Opportunity Quilt - Cathy reported that the tickets are ready for members to pick up, she has given out 32 books so far. Pictures of the Quilt will be ready at the April Meeting.

Programs - 10 people have signed up so far for the May Appliqué class. There are only 10 more slots left. Check with Linda Barlow if you are interested.

3. Sharp small scissors for cutting paper, Sharp small fabric scissors.

4. Roxanne's ® “Glue-Baste-it” or ® “Quilter's Choice” or other fabric basting glue. These are wash-  
able glues...

5. Permanent Fabric glue...®Aleene's “Its OK to Wash it”, or ® “Jewel it” are two good Permanent  
glues. Buy the small size because this glue will last a long time and you only need a small bit.

6. Small acrylic or plastic cutting board...Rotary Cutter boards are too porous, better to use a piece of  
plastic ..You need a piece that is at least 8 X 11...A large plastic lid will also work...I buy cheap bread  
boards or cutting boards at the 99 cent store or at flea markets.

7. Small plastic cup for water.

8. Baby Wipes or wipes to clean hands and boards.

9. Basic sewing box supplies...pins, thimbles, needles (®Clover Appliqué Gold Eye size 10 are great)  
and other tools in your basket.

10. Pieces of Batik or textured prints that read as solid fabrics of your color choices, greens for leaves  
and stems...Several unusual background prints to audition (Fat quarters are big enough, this is just to  
play around). I will bring some fabric with me to share.

11. Assorted threads to match fabrics. (we will not get to sewing so this is optional) I will show the ap-  
pliqué stitch in details.

12. Pens or pencils to take notes.

Optional: Small iron and pressing board, toothpicks (big ones!).





Simmer 30 minutes






