San Juan Quilters Guild Board Meeting 14 March 2024

Present: Georgia Cortez, Ellen Vandruff, Karen Brimhall, Donna Hunter, Cathy Otten, Lisa Willems, Cathy Hale, Susan Nelson, Alice Trujillo, Lori Cosby, Cheryl Hough, Kathy Elsbury

Georgia Cortez called the meeting to order. Ellen Vandruff read the January minutes. Lori Cosby moved to approve the minutes; Cheryl Hough seconded the motion.

Donna Hunter, Treasurer, reported on the budget. There was discussion about expenses related to storage unit rental fees and the possibility of combining the community service and quilt show supplies/equipment storage units; however, it was decided to keep these units separate. Cash received has been from door prizes, advertising and membership.

Cathy Otten, Vice President, announced that Lisa Willems has graciously agreed to make the 2025 Opportunity Quilt. Lisa showed pictures of the pattern she has selected and discussed her choice of fabrics and colors. Cheryl mentioned that opportunity quilts should measure at least 96 by 96 to fit a queen size bed.

Georgia Cortez, President, continues to work on additional locations, in addition to the Farmington Museum, for display of the New Mexico quilt challenge.

Programs: Susan Nelson said that she visited the Rocky Mountain Quilt Museum and viewed the current display of Men Who Quilt. Susan has left messages for the Executive Director about possible speakers/teachers for our guild in 2025. She will continue to follow up. The Programs Committee asked for suggestions from members regarding teachers we can contact who may be interested in presenting to our guild. The Committee would like to bring in someone to do a workshop in 2025. Cheryl would like suggestions about the type of applique program to do in August. It was agreed that she'll do one pattern that can be done using various applique methods. The Programs Committee will meet after the guild meeting in May.

Hospitality: Alice Trujillo said that at the February meeting some members mentioned that they were reluctant to use the Sign-up Genuis for potlucks. Therefore, Alice did not use that method in March which resulted in very few potluck options. It was agreed that we will go back to the Sign-up Genuis for potlucks. Ellen agreed to do a test sample to send to members to help them become more familiar and less wary of this option. Georgia will ask the Civic Center to furnish water.

Georgia also stated that if members have a complaint with the hosting venue (Civic Center or Quilt Show location) or their staff, those complaints should go to Georgia. Members should not take their complaints or criticisms to the hosting venue or their employees.

Membership: Kathy Elsbury reported that we have 53 members and two auxiliary members. Kathy showed a flyer Malinda Peine put together about the guild and listing meeting dates. However, the watermark makes it difficult to read and does not lend itself to generating clear copies. Lisa will ask Melinda to remove the watermark. Susan suggested adding the year 2024 to the flyer.

There was discussion regarding distribution of the membership roster. The roster will be distributed at the April meeting; therefore, membership dues must be received in March in order to be included in the roster. Kathy will not be at the April meeting, so Susan has volunteered to help Kathy with the roster distribution. Kathy is also looking for someone to handle membership at Saturday guild meetings. Cathy Otten suggested that perhaps we can put together a pool of volunteer members that we can access when someone is out sick, on vacation, etc.

Community Service: Lori Cosby said she got a lot of tops back from the community sew day in February; now she needs backs. Lori is running low on labels and will place an order for more.

Opportunity Quilt: Ellen Vandruff reported that the sleeve and label are on, and the quilt will be hung at Four Corners Gathering. Due to her hand surgery, she will be limited in assisting Karen with ticket sales. Cathy Hale said she would help out.

Newsletter: Lisa Willems reported that the deadline for the April/May newsletter is March 25.

Advertising/Publicity: Cathy Otten asked about the small cards we had talked about producing to place at quilt shops and hand out at the fair and shows that states the time of month the guild meets and our web address. Georgia is going to develop the cards and get them printed.

Sunshine: Cathy Hale needs cards and postage. Donna Hunter said that postage is covered under a separate line item in the budget and does not come out of the Sunshine Committee budget. However, because Cathy is short on sympathy and get-well cards, she requested to increase the budget from \$25 to \$50. Cathy Otten moved to increase the budget per Cathy Hale's recommendation. Donna Hunter seconded the motion.

Nominating Committee: Georgia mentioned that the Nominating Committee needs to be established at the April meeting. This is a responsibility of the Vice President.

Strategic Planning: Georgia would like to have a separate meeting on this topic. It was agreed that we would meet on April 18, 2024 at 10:00 at Cheryl Hough's home.

Lori Cosby motioned to adjourn the meeting; Alice Trujillo seconded,




