The committee heads for the quilt show are mostly filled, but we still need volunteers to help on these committees. I know that we will all step up to help where we are needed.


I have had a lot of positive feedback on all the classes and guest quilters that Georgia has lined up for the guild this year. She is doing a great job.

Cheryl Hough will provide the wood and felt pieces for this workshop. This workshop provides opportunities to explore textile in whatever design you are interested in. Totems can be adapted to many different themes, i.e. holidays or significant events. I will be adapting my totem to Lady of Guadalupe. Cost of workshop is \$30.

May – Carmen Geddess will be giving the Piccadilly Squares workshop on Saturday, May 13 from 10am to 4pm at Piedra Vista High School. The handout is available at the guild meetings plus the supply list will be given out at the time you sign up. This will be an exciting class to show off your 2.5 inch square piecing into a beautiful quilt. This class has 6 EasyPiecing Grid Border panels and is 52" X 66". You will need to do some prepping before class. This is a good workshop for jelly rolls. Class Fee is \$30 plus a kit fee of \$25.


Thank you and let's get signed up for these workshops.

Looking forward to being with you this year!




