

San Juan Quilters Guild Board Meeting Minutes—July 14, 2022

Call to Order:

Meeting called to order by Annette Lee, President

Minutes of the May 2022 Board Meeting were read by Kim Duke, Secretary

Georgia Cortez made a motion to approve the minutes, Karen Brimhall seconded.

Treasurer's Report

Report was given by Cathy Otten who was filling in for Susan Nelson. She reported that our insurance costs have increased again. A copy of the treasurer's report is available to any member upon request.

Old Business

There had been some questions about whether or not the San Juan County Fair would allow quilt entrants to sell their quilts at the fair. Gail Hoffman presented the question to the fair board and they agreed to let entrants put a note on the quilt saying it is for sale with the contact information of the person selling it. This means that the quilts must be tagged when entering them in the fair and the seller and the buyer must make arrangements after the fair to exchange money. The San Juan County Fair will not be involved in the sale of quilts in any other capacity, nor will the quilt guild.

Bert Roark still needs officers and committee chairs for next year.

Ellen Vandruff still needs many spots filled for working at the fair.

We are still in need of someone to head up the December meeting.

Karen Brimhall reported that they had good response and ticket sales were good when they put the opportunity quilt in the Art Walk. Wal Art displayed the quilt for us and they purchased tickets for the drawing.

New Business

Lori Cosby delivered items to Santa Fe for fire victims. She also delivered to SANE, the Women's Shelter, Beehive House, and the new Three Rivers facility for the elderly.

Karen Brimhall received cut outs of adult bibs and thought they might be a project we could do for community service.

Cheryl Hough thought it would be a good idea to do a program next year on the bullseye quilt and she would be willing to teach it. Bert Roark suggested a class on stack and slash.

Georgia Cortez said she would write those ideas down for the programs chairperson for next year.

The August program will be Re-Stash, and September's program will include, class for making your own name tag and name tags for guests which will be different from member tags.

Also, Georgia plans to go over guild etiquette and will have an activity for deciding the quilt show theme. The October class will be a wool class and November will be a virtual class on curved piecing which will be offered to members at no charge.

Vernell Andrews will purchase more gift certificates to last through the end of this year, and one month in to the new year.

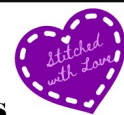

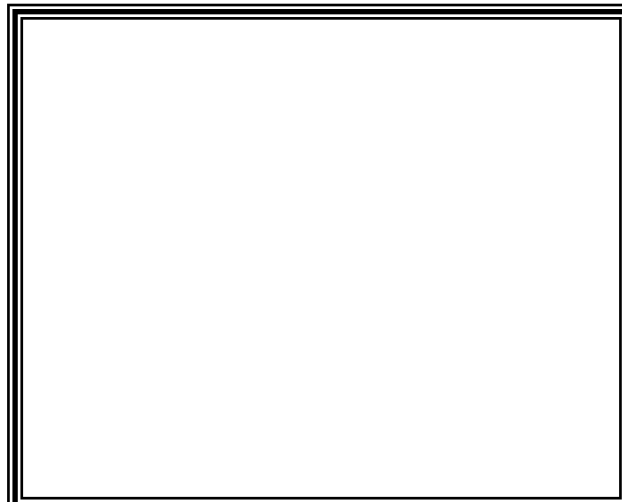
