Meeting called to order by Georgia Cortez, President.

Minutes of November 14, 2024 board meeting read by Ellen Vandruff, Secretary. Minutes approved as read by Donna Hunter, 2nd by Cathy Otten, all approved.

Kathy Elsbury - Membership - 28 paid members currently. Plans for moving forward - Lisa will deliver membership forms to Shelley Frazier for Saturday. Those with current paid membership will be included in the roster in April.

Susan Nelson - Door Prizes - 20 gift certificates purchased. Will make arrangements with Shelley Frazier for Saturday group usage.

Lisa Willems - Newsletter - Deadline for current newsletter is January 25. Questions about advertising were addressed. Lori Cosby is handling ads again.

Ellen Vandruff - Side Raffle and Opportunity Quilt - 2 side raffle quilts donated already. Ellen has issued an offer to quilt tops that will be donated to the side raffle. Advertising for opportunity quilt was also discussed. New ways of receiving payments for tickets were discussed.

Lori Cosby - Community Service and Advertising - organizing materials in preparation to pass off to Susan Nelson. Reported that Ann McKee is helping with community service. Working on advertising for newsletter and writing the letter for vendors for the Quilt Show. Will make August 15 the cut off for previous show vendors.

Donna Hunter - Treasurer - handed out cash reports and projected budget. Lori motioned to approve projected budget, Kathy Elsbury 2nd, all approved.

Open discussion held about Hospitality being currently unchaired leading to members bringing sack lunches, when our meetings are projected to run into lunch time. Lori Cosby mentioned the need to change the amount being donated to the Presbyterian Church for our additional meetings. Discussion was held and the decision was made to change our donation amount to \$150.00. All in attendance approved.


San Juan County Fair Side Raffle Quilts


