San Juan Quilters Guild Board Meeting 13 March, 2025

Georgia Cortez called the meeting to order. Cathy Otten read the January minutes. Georgia moved to approve the minutes; Kathy Elsbury seconded the motion.

Georgia announced that she will be resigning as President the end of April. Cathy Otten and Kathy Elsbury will take over sooner than usual as President and Vice President. Georgia will make the announcement of her resignation to the Guild at the April meeting. This change will necessitate a new membership chair. Shanna Uhl has agreed to take over Membership and Sharon Hastings will assist.

Donna Hunter, Treasurer, reported on the budget and gave a recap of revenue and expenses. Revenue exceeded expenses for this reporting period. Cash received has been from door prize tickets, advertising, quilt show vendors, and membership. This is Donna's last year as Treasurer and she will start looking for a replacement to mentor.

Kathy Elsbury, Membership, reported that 42 members have renewed but that our membership is way down. Kathy will make note of who has not renewed and contact them. Kathy will be working on the roster of members this month. She distributed the guild surveys at the March meeting and received a lot back. Kathy will put together a summary of responses and review with Georgia. The survey results will be discussed at the May board meeting.

Georgia will be meeting with Drew at the Museum on March 18 to discuss the quilt show display scheduled for November and December. Cathy Otten said that by a hand count at the guild meeting not many members are participating in the Everything But The Kitchen Sink challenge. However, there are a lot of members participating in making banners based on the season of their birth for the Quilt Show. Lisa Willems had suggested that both challenges be displayed at the Museum and the members were in support of that idea. Therefore, the challenge reveal has been changed to September and both challenges will be displayed at the museum.

Quilt Show: Susan Nelson has flyers and bookmarks. She received a draft of postcards today to send out to quilt shops. QR codes are on the postcards. The next Quilt Show meeting will be March 27 at 10:00 at the library. The topic for the meeting is Quilters Market and advertising.

Susan said she has also been in touch with the Aztec Chamber of Commerce. They are interested in doing a one day display of random quilts from our members. Susan will be the point person for this display. The Chamber would also like someone to speak to the Chamber about our Guild. It was suggested to contact Connie Nordstrum to see if she would be interested since she has an in-depth knowledge of the guild's history.

Opportunity Quilt: The quilt is finished and looks great. It's very eye catching. It was displayed at the March guild meeting. Ellen has already sold \$25 worth of tickets.

Cathy Otten reviewed progress for 4 Corners Quilt Gathering. The pots are all done. She gave special recognition to Shanna Uhl who spearheaded this project and made a huge amount of the fat quarter flowers. Cathy also mentioned the significant contribution of Connie Polzin who put together hundreds of skewers with ribbon bows and spools of thread to add to the pots. Connie also made and donated 120 potholders to set the pots on. Cathy spoke to Stitch and Quilted Corners who will provide us gift cards and coupons to insert into the name tag wallets. Once a final roster is received from Barb Morgan, Cathy will work on labels with participant names. Barb Morgan told Cathy we can't get into the library until 9:00 that morning, so it will be all hands on deck to get everything set up. Cathy said she has received quite a few door prizes. She and Susan will get together later this month to organize door prizes.

Kathy Elsbury mentioned that she has a contact who will do embroidery on shirts if we are still interested in having shirts made with the guild's name and logo. She'll get some prices for discussion with members.

- 1. Community Service—Make a community service scrap quilt, any size from the fabric scrap bags handed out at the November meeting. Reveal at the May guild meeting. If you didn't get a scrap bag, you can use your own stash to make a community service quilt. Questions: Bev Spellbring.
- 2. Everything But the Kitchen Sink—Make a quilt, any size that uses scraps (orphan blocks from previous projects, a collection of items that are part of family history, i.e. embroidery or something from a family member, handkerchief or pieces of clothing that bring good memories of a family member). A reflection of you! Reveal at the September guild meeting. Questions: Georgia Cortez
- 3. Quilting Through the Seasons Banner—Make a quilt banner that represents the season of the month you were born. Size 12-18" x 24-30", portrait or landscape. Reveal at the Quilt show in October. Questions: Ellen Vandruff

San Juan County Fair Side Raffle Quilts






